Presenting Problems: Cal is a 6 year-old, Salvadorian male, who was referred by his school, for possible post traumatic stress disorder. Records indicate that he suffered sexual assault on multiple occasions by a teenager living at the same shelter, while his client and his family were awaiting court hearing their application for asylum in the U.S. Mother reported that both parents were forced to work in a warehouse in order to stay at the shelter and could not protect Cal and his older sister. Normally a joyful child, Cal was now quiet and tearful and had bouts of anger. In addition to the mood change his parents had first noticed, he now struggled to sleep, was not eating well and was soiling himself. After several days of mother pleading with him about "What is wrong?", he finally disclosed he was sexually assaulted. Cal was also being threatened to be beaten up by a group of teenage boys; however, when his older sister jumped in to protect him, they attacked and raped his sister. They forced him to run away, while they attacked her; but he is still haunted by hearing her call out for his help. His parents reported that they were away working and had no knowledge that these threats and attacks were happening to their children. Currently at school, Cal seems "checked out", gets triggered and upset easily by peers, often requiring him to be sent to the office. He complained that kids were picking on him at school, and he needed protection, even though teachers have not seen any hostility shown by classmates towards him.

History of Presenting Problem: Mother reported that the family was attempting to seek asylum from their home country in El Salvador 4 months ago. Before they traveled to the border, Cal's family had been extorted for months by members of a local gang in El Salvador. The gang demanded a weekly fee for protection. When Cal's father was assaulted for not making the payment, leaving him severely injured and permanently blind in one eye, Cal's parents decided it wasn't safe for Cal and his older sister to be raised in their hometown. So the family fled from El Salvador toward the U.S. to seek asylum. After 2 grueling months, they finally arrived at a shelter in Juarez, Mexico. They did not know, unfortunately, that 850,000 hearings of immigration cases had been put on hold, so they were stuck at the shelter until their number would be called. With hundreds of families living at this shelter, resources were scarce, and both parents were forced to find work at a warehouse making zippers. As the days became weeks, and then months, they noticed Cal becoming more withdrawn and fearful. After his symptoms worsen over the next week, mother was able to find out what had happened to Cal and his older sister. His parents were angry with Cal for running away when his sister was attacked and raped and not helping her. Cal felt extremely guilty and cannot talk about what happened to him or his sister.

The family was finally granted asylum after several months and have now settled in Santa Ana, California. Cal continues to have problems being withdrawn, fearful, emotionally reactive and not adjusting to starting school. Cal's family was referred to CYS MHRS East by the school due to the reported sexual abuse and his struggles staying at school. The school psychologist referred both the client and his older sister for mental health evaluations and treatment of possible PTSD.

Client's Strengths: Cal was described by mother to be a joyful, fun-loving child prior to his abuse and being threatened when sister was attacked. He was described as good-hearted and kind and had a good relationship with his parents prior to the trauma.

Client's social supports, hobbies, interests: Client had good family relationship and was able to make friends and communicate his needs prior to the experienced trauma during the migration.

Diagnostic/clinical impression : Cal appears to be suffering from F43.11 Post-traumatic stress disorder, acute as he has directly experienced sexual assaults on multiple occasions by a teenage boy in the same shelter, and witnessed his older sister being gang raped and feeling helpless to protect her. Cal also appears to be having recurrent and distressing memories that are expressed in his current social relationships at school as he claims peers want to pick on and harm him, even though the teacher has not observed any of those situations. His appearance to be "checked out" may also be dissociative reactions. Cal makes persistent attempts to avoid going to school to avoid other kids and is exacerbated by his IBS and stomach problems. He experiences much sadness and guilt regarding his inability to help his older sister and is distraught about his parents being angry with him for not protecting her. He has experienced these problems for the past 6 months since the traumatic event, and these problems are affecting his ability to learn, concentrate and form friendships in school. He is currently not making a good adjustment in his new home and school. Cal is likely having trauma abreacons at school as certain situations trigger memories when he is with peers or with his teacher. His struggle with his teacher may be related to his struggle to tell his parents what happened to him and his older sister as their initial angry reaction at him. There may be some learning problems that has not yet been identified; however, the school is currently assessing him for any learning disabilities. School problems may also be related living in a fearful state of mind most of the time, that Cal cannot concentrate or learn as he is mostly concerned about surviving and protecting himself and his family.

Determination of: medical necessity, level of care, access criteria: Cal meets the automatic access criteria for specialty mental health services due to exposure to trauma. He meets medical necessity due to F43.11 PTSD, acute diagnosis and subsequent impairments in living arrangement/family functioning, school/academics and social relationships. He qualifies for PWB/IS under intensive services as he is being considered for special education because of his problems learning and being in school, that would be detrimental to his development. Based on this assessment, Cal meets the outpatient level of care from the MHP for specialty mental health services.

Evaluations

Treatment recommendations: Cal would benefit from individual and family therapy with a focus on psychoeducation for both client and parents on the effects of trauma on children and families. Cal would benefit from learning how his fight/flight part of his brain is triggered by trauma memories, and how his body holds many of his nonverbal pain. He would benefit from learning how to regulate his body and stress level. Some tools could be taught where he can relax his body through breathing and bilateral movement. EMDR (evidenced based therapy) can be beneficial in therapy by helping Cal process his painful memories without overwhelming him through keeping his body regulated. ICC can help link Cal's family to needed resources that lowers the stress on the family due to poverty. Peer support specialist with lived experience of overcoming trauma abuse may help by partnering with the family and working with both Cal and his parents. Working through the unresolved grief of the parents and children and the pain from the immigration trauma, sexual abuse, experiencing homelessness while living in a shelter for 4 months, and helping Cal deal with the guilt he feels toward his sister are all problems that likely need to be addressed in therapy. Medication services may be considered if Cal continues to be depressed, especially if his passive suicidal statements become more prominent.
