Diagnosis Treated Today :

1. Post-traumatic stress disorder, acute (F43.11)

Purpose of Visit: Problem addressed today: F43.11 - Cal was referred by his teacher and school psychologist for sudden emotional outbursts in class, complaints against peers threatening harm although teachers and playground monitors have not observed these events, and fears that teacher and vice principal think he's lying. School psychologist suspects that Cal may have been physically or sexually abused while immigrating from El Salvador to the U.S. and seems to freeze and cannot share any history or memories from his homeland. Cal in the first 2 months has already missed 7 days from school for complaints of stomach problems. School has warned parents note after 9 absences that he might face consequences of being considered truant.

Intervention PN: Conducted initial intake with mother and Cal including review of client and family's rights, informed consent, review of the assessment process, begin gathering information and history surrounding presenting problem, conducted MSE and immediate risk assessment. Cal was nervous and gave short yes/no answers. He didn't seem to be able to verbalize much about the problems at school, and didn't seem open to discussing his family's immigration over to the U.S. He was able to verbalize that he is afraid his teacher thinks he is lying about his classmates threatening him. After allowing Cal to visit the playroom and allow mother to talk freely with the therapist, mother was able to confirm that Cal and his older sister were allegedly physically and sexually abused. The mother would also like to start therapy for her older daughter also. Mother reported that Cal has not been able to tell her what exactly happened as he gets extremely frightened and upset, but he did indicate that an older boy touched him and threatened him if he told anyone. Mother believes that this happened over multiple occasions while she and father were out trying to find work to stay at the shelter while they applied for asylum to the U.S. Mother reported no danger to self although he often complains about going to school and on several occasions stated he would rather die than go to school. Mother had to stop the interview after Cal was done playing and wanted to go home.

MHS Assessment PN Plan: Mother confirmed that Cal is struggling with trauma and likely meets medical necessity for specialty mental health services. Will plan to complete assessment after next session to determine what needs Cal and his family has as well as assist mother in getting Cal's older sister in for evaluation and treatment if clinically indicated. Will also consult with school psychologist regarding safety plan to help Cal feel safe at school.
