Presenting Problems : Adriana is a 5 year old Honduran female, who was referred to CEGU by SSA Social Worker for a mental health assessment and treatment. Adriana was placed at Orangewood after border patrol agents found her and her 12 year old cousin Leti frightened, hungry and alone. Adriana was evaluated by CAST and placed at Orangewood. She was then referred to CEGU for evaluation and treatment. The records indicated the elder cousin, Leti reported they were sent by their parents to cross a bridge to the U.S. border with other strangers while their parents waited in Mexico at the camp for an appointment to enter into the U.S. Per report obtained from the social worker. Adriana was dirty, wearing a torn T-shirt and filthy pants. She was malodorous. Adriana was separated from her cousin and placed with other children at the detention center in their age group, since they were unaccompanied minors. They were interviewed by detention staff onsite and eventually placed in the custody of Orange County Social Services as dependents. Adriana was referred for an assessment due to an exacerbation of adjustment symptoms including uncontrollable excessive crying spells, fears, anxiety, bed-wetting (nocturnal), with scratching and complaints of stomach aches. She refused to eat when she was first placed in Orangewood. Her 12 year-old cousin, Leti was also placed in Orangewood in a separate cottage.

Adriana has frequent nightmares, bed-wetting, and she defecates and smears on walls. She becomes fearful and agitated when separating from cottage staff. She is aggressive toward peers and adults. She reports that she was very sad and had been "a bad girl, so her mommy sent her away." She can be heard often saying, "I want my mama." According to the social worker's interview report, Adriana's mother, uncle and the two girls had been staying in a tent encampment waiting for the court to allow their parents to come to the U.S. The parents decided to send the girls without supervision, with the exception of other unaccompanied minors and strangers crossing the bridge to the U.S. with the hope that the children would be taken into custody by border patrol. Adrian's cousin reported that their parents had to stay in Mexico to wait for permission to come to the U.S. The parents stayed without them, because they were concerned about the increasing dangers of the encampment. Leti reported to Adriana's mother that a man tried to touch Adriana's privates, while they were sleeping, so the mother and uncle decided the children had to leave the encampment first.

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History of Presenting Problem : Adriana reported to the social worker: "I'm mad, and I hate everyone here. You are a bad person! My mommy made me go away with Leti, and I'm not going to see my mommy again. You need to find my mama." Social worker reports that client and her 12 year-old female cousin were sent with a group of children by their parents to cross the U.S. border for safety and a better life. The 12 year-old reported that her dad (Adriana's uncle) and Adriana's mother wanted to go to the U.S. because Adriana's father was killed in a drive-by shooting, and mother was afraid that the gangs and

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the bad man, who tried to touch Adriana at the encampment, would come back and hurt the girls. Leti stated many bad things happened from Honduras to Mexico. Xochitl, Adriana's mother was sad and cried a lot according to Leti. Adriana reported to the interviewer at the detention center that mother and uncle told them they were going to have a better life, and made them go away. Mother had previously attempted to seek asylum and was waiting for a hearing for months. Her uncle was also waiting for a hearing for himself and Leti. In the attempt to travel to the border, the family experienced dangerous weather, witnessed deaths of individuals drowning; and they were in substandard conditions (living in tents for months). Leti reported that Adriana's mother implored the immigration agents of their dire situation and that she had witnessed and knew of several people, who died crossing the border. She was convinced that she and Adriana would be killed by gangs, just like her husband was killed; so they could not return to their homeland for fear they would be hurt or killed. Xochitl, Adriana, the uncle and Leti were forced to wait in the encampment until the mother's hearing date.

Leti reported that the conditions were horrible. It was dirty and there was little food and water. Adriana's mother felt it was too dangerous. Her mother and uncle made the decision to send Adriana with her older cousin to the U.S., because they felt they would be safer than staying in Mexico. Adriana did not want to leave her mom. She was sad because her mother was always sad, nervous and upset. Adriana was also missing her father. Adriana reported feeling hungry all the time because they had very little to eat and no money to buy food. However, she never wanted to leave Mexico and lose both her mom and dad and was afraid she would never find them again.

Adriana states that she hates being with the children and staff at the Orangewood. She wants her mother, uncle and cousin to all be together again. Once she was placed at Orangewood, Adriana's tantrums and crying spells became worse. She would self isolate and refuse to communicate with staff, and had difficulty communicating and cooperating with peers. She hits and fights with peers and staff. Her bed-wetting has increased nightly. She states continuously to staff that she is sad that mother is gone and is scared what will happen to her. She has said that her mother must have sent her away because she is a bad girl.

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Describe : Minor was molested by male stranger over her clothing while sleeping in the encampment. The stranger touched and rubbed client's chest and pelvic area.

If Yes, please describe any negative life circumstances (eg: homelessness) or placements (eg: foster care) which resulted from the past or current Abuse or Trauma? : According to records, social services received from border agents, Adriana's father was murdered during a drive by shooting in Mexico, when the family was applying for asylum. Report indicated that mother and Adriana were inside the home during the shooting. Report also indicated that the family was running from the gangs as he refused to participate and sell drugs for them. Mother was fearful that she and Adriana would be killed which is the reason for her fear for safety and seeking asylum. Client and mother left and traveled with her uncle and cousin to the U.S. border. The family was awaiting a hearing to process their asylum. They were sheltered in a tent encampment on the Mexico side of the border pending their hearing. While in the encampment, Adriana was molested by an adult stranger. Mother and uncle decided to send the girls to the U.S. border unaccompanied after the incident to protect the girls, so they might be safer in the U.S.

Family History (narrative for additional details) : Adriana is the only child of Xochitl and Hector Luz. Adriana was born in a small town in Honduras, Central America where the family resided during her first 5 years. According to SSA records, Hector died 6 months ago following a drive by shooting by local gang members, who wanted Hector to sell drugs in their town. The shooting occurred outside of the home when father exited the residence. Adriana and her mother were inside when the shooting occurred. Mother ran outside and saw her spouse on the ground wounded. Adriana was indoors and ran outdoors to her mother as she heard her screaming. Mother attempted to shield Adriana from seeing her father; however, Adriana realized as neighbors arrived to check on the family that her father was injured. He was taken to receive emergency treatment, but he passed away. Following father's passing, mother received threats directed toward her and Adriana if they reported the shooters. Mother was also informed that due to father's death, mother would need to sell drugs. Mother reported that she and her brother decided that they wanted to leave Mexico with their two daughter, Adriana and Leti to go to the U.S. Mother, brother and the children traveled to the border. They experienced threats of violence, food and shelter insecurities while traveling to reach the U.S. border from Central America

Client's Strengths : Adriana is a caring child. She speaks highly of her relationship with her 12 year old cousin. She is able to articulate that she misses her cousin and wants to be place with her.

Client's social supports, hobbies, interests : Adriana has been isolating from cottage staff and peers. She has been scratching her arms and bed-wetting on a nightly basis. She cries and expresses that she wants to see her cousin Leti and go home to her mommy. She states she loves her mom and expresses that she was bad so her mother sent her away. She also misses her father stating that bad people killed him.

Social Relationships/ Communication Skills Impairment : Yes

Symptoms : Adriana has difficult using her words when she is stressed, upset or having a trauma abreaction. She has disturbed sleep and experiences nightmares almost every night.

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Behaviors : Adriana cries, tantrums, bed wets nightly. She is physically aggressive with adults and peers and scratches on her arms until they're raw.

Impairments : Her inability to use her words and process her trauma puts her at risk for being physically aggressive which jeopardizes any foster placement.

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DOMAIN 7 - Clinical Summary

I am a Licensed or licensed waived provider : Yes

Diagnostic/clinical impression : Adriana appears to be suffering from F43.11 Post Traumatic Stress Disorder - Acute; F32.9 Major Depressive Disorder, single episode, unspecified; F93.0 Separation Anxiety Disorder; F98.0 Enuresis (nocturnal) and T74.22XA Child Sexual Abuse - confirmed. She recently experienced sexual molestation by an adult stranger while living in tent encampment near the border with parent and relatives. She has experienced multiple losses and trauma including the tragic death of father. Mother and Adriana left home bound for the U.S. border with her uncle and his 12 year old daughter in an effort to re-locate to the U.S. for safety and improved quality of life. Unfortunately, they experienced much stress during their travel and journey to the U.S.

Adriana appears to exhibit depression manifested in uncontrollable crying spells, sadness, grief due to loss of parents, fear of separation from adults, increased dependency/clinginess, nocturnal bed-wetting, aggression and fighting with peers and adults. Adriana also suffers from unresolved multiple traumas that culminated when she and her cousin were forced to leave her mother and uncle and cross over to the U.S. She has not been able to make an adjustment to her placement in Orangewood and is not stable yet to be transitioned to foster care. She is very tense, overwhelmed and is acting out aggressively toward peers and staff.

Determination of: medical necessity, level of care, access criteria : Due to multiple traumatic experiences, Adriana meets both the access criteria and medical necessity for specialty mental health services. She meets the following diagnostic criteria for F43.11 PTSD - acute; F32.9 Major depressive disorder, single episode, unspecified; F93.0 Separation Anxiety Disorder; F98.0 Enuresis (nocturnal) and T74.22XA Child sexual abuse - confirmed. Her symptoms and behaviors, if left untreated, put her at risk for not making an adjustment in foster care and requiring a higher level of care. She is also at risk for not developing normally in education and peer relationships as a result of her traumas and mental disorders if left untreated. Adriana will also qualify for PWB and for ICC/IHBS services as she is in the child welfare system.

Treatment recommendations : Adriana is likely to benefit from individual therapy to assist her with processing, focusing and healing from multiple traumas including the loss of parents (via death and abandonment), alleged child abuse (via molestation by stranger) and anxiety/trauma ab reactions associated with separation from parents and relatives (including separation from her 12 year-old cousin, who accompanied her across the border). Adrian experienced exposure to danger during her travel including poor hygiene, lack of food/water and poor shelter. Minor, who is monolingual Spanish speaking, is currently awaiting foster placement. She requires a trauma informed therapist with cultural sensitivity who can work with Adriana on improving her ability to cope with multiple losses and decreasing aggressive behaviors towards adults and peers. She would benefit from ICC services to coordinate care for her placement in foster care system and insure that her mental health needs continue through transitions. She would also benefit from connecting with a medical doctor who would treat her stomach problems and assess the medical components of her pain. Coordination of care with educational system will also be important in addressing how the mental health issues impacts her education. IHBS would benefit helping the patient practice and utilize her coping skills.
